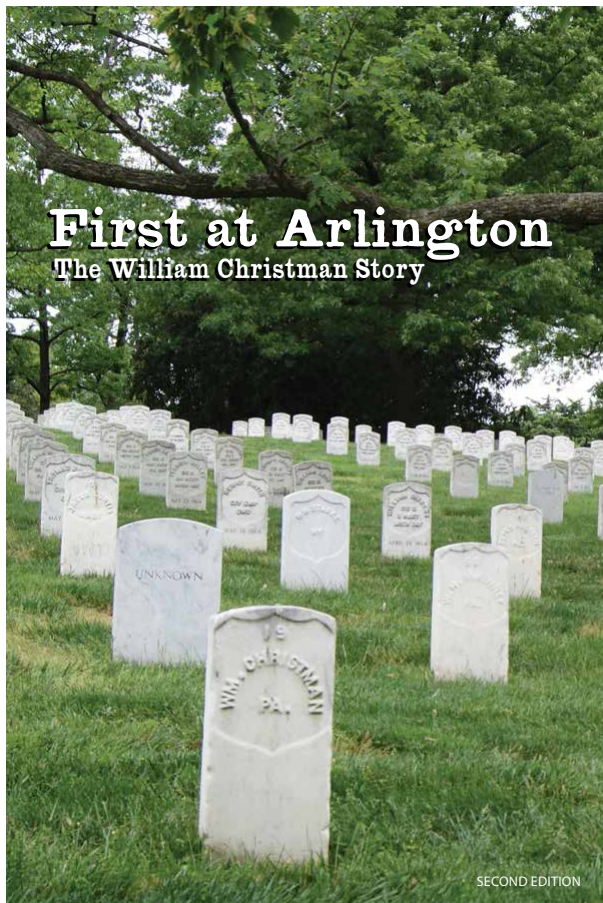

First at Arlington **The William Christman Story**

In 1864 at age 20, William Henry Christman left his family and the community of Tobyhanna Township in northeastern Pennsylvania to fight for his country in the Civil War.

He died in service on May 11 in a Washington, D.C. military hospital. Two days later, Private William Henry Christman was the first soldier to be buried at the new Arlington National Cemetery.

This book highlights Pvt. Christman's family life, his military career, his death during the Civil War and his legacy, epitomized by his unique status at Arlington. The story shows how his sacrifice helped establish the family he left behind.

This Second Edition is expanded with the account of William Christman's older brother Barnabus and his involvement and death at the intense Battle of Glendale, as well as new information concerning the brothers and their family. The 150th year Arlington National Cemetery commemoration of William Christman's burial, which took place the day after the launch of the first edition, is also documented.

More than 50 photographs and illustrations, many in color, document this historical account of national significance and local community pride.
